



FISCAL COURT ORDER
DECLARATION OF LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY

On motion by Marty Chandler, Seconded by Blake Tarpley

With all 5 members voting in favor, the motion passed.

The record is ordered to reflect that, pursuant to KRS 67.078, the Simpson County Fiscal Court finds that an emergency exists as follows: a local project for removing an illegal dump has exceeded the anticipated budget, with contractors on site being required to complete and closeout said project by December 31st of this year; this project will require an additional appropriation of up to \$400,000, to be reimbursed with Division of Waste Management grant funds, and require a budget ordinance amending the existing budget; ordinances are required to have publication and two readings before becoming effective, which would be impossible to do to allow for the project to proceed and be completed; therefore, this emergency order will bypass the publication and two readings provision of the ordinance statutes and make said ordinance effective immediately upon passage by the Fiscal Court.
