

Regular Joint Term, Tuesday Day, 5<sup>th</sup> Day of March 20 19

At a regular joint meeting of the Franklin City Commission and Simpson County Fiscal Court held in the City Hall Meeting Room located at 117 West Cedar St Franklin, Kentucky, March 5, 2019, at noon

Mayor Larry Dixon called City Commission into session and County Judge Executive Mason Barnes called Fiscal Court into session followed with prayer by Mayor Dixon and the pledge of allegiance to the American flag led by Judge Executive Barnes.

City Manager Kenton Powell introduced Dr. Kim Myers, Director of Workforce Solutions at SKYCTC, who presented an update on the CDL training program and truck pad construction at the Franklin Campus of the Southcentral Kentucky Community and Technical College. She reported that the program was announced in November of 2017 and began in June 2018 with fifty-one students now having successfully completed the program with a 100% job placement reported. Students must be at least eighteen and be able to read, write and speak English. The CDL truck training pad, which is being funded by SKYCTC, City of Franklin, Simpson County Fiscal Court, Franklin-Simpson Industrial Authority and Franklin Bank & Trust, is not yet complete but Nacarato located just across the interstate from the SKYCTC Franklin Campus has allowed the use of an area there for training purposes. The program does not yet offer college credit but accreditation is anticipated and will offer six hours of college credit which will be retroactive for students who have successfully completed the program. She reported that a simulator will be added to the program within a couple of months. Dr. Myers commended the support of all entities in the community who have contributed to the success of this program. The cost of the program is \$3,850 per student which includes everything except the cost of the permit fee and the average beginning salary is \$50,000.

City Manager Kenton Powell reported that he and Shauna Cornwell, City Finance Director and County Judge Executive Mason Barnes and Nicole Law, County Finance Director have met with Scott Waste Services to explore renegotiation of the contracts jointly and are waiting to hear back from Scott on requests made during those discussions.

The city manager also reported that five applications have been received for the advertised position of Franklin-Simpson Planning and Zoning Administrator with the last day for submitting applications to be Friday, March 1<sup>st</sup>.

City Commissioners Jamie Powell and Wendell Stewart were the sponsors of City Ordinance 2019.008 authorizing the Interlocal Agreement Regarding Planning and Zoning and authorizing the City Mayor Dixon to sign with City Clerk Cathy Dillard delivering the first summary reading of said ordinance.

Emergency Management Director Robert Palmer addressed the joint session to request that since the ERMA mapping system will not be renewed, could the county piggy-back on the city's license for the Esri GIS mapping software? This would allow for live-time mapping and re-routing for multiple response agencies for both city and county in the interest of public safety for the entire community.
